PRESCOTT HILL CLIMB 2010 SEASON INTRODUCTION

THE COURSE All meetings will be run on the Long Course.

In accordance with MSA Track regulations the barriers on the hill are double height. In places earth banks have been cut back and tyres or 'Recticel barriers' put in front to support the soil.

ENTRY FEES

The fee for 2 day events in 2010 is £98-00 for Bugatti OC members and £108-00 for non-members.

The fee for 1 day events in 2010 is £93-00 for Bugatti OC members and £103-00 for non-members.

A proportion of the fees will be used to fund and upgrade the equipment used by the Midland Hill Climb Rescue Unit and towards the Midland Marshals award scheme.

Entry fee refunds for competitors cancelling their entries are as follows;

Cancellation 12 days or more prior to meeting - Full refund less £10-00 administration charge.

Cancellation 11 to 5 days prior to the meeting – Full refund less £25-00 administration charge.

Cancellation less than five days prior to meeting – Per Capita and Insurance only upon application to the Entries Secretary - up to 7 days after the meeting.

RUNNING ORDER

Practice and the event will be run in class and numerical order, unless indicated in the official programme or final instructions, with the exception of Bugatti cars and the Top Twelve run-offs.

Shared drives; (where both drivers are entered in the same class). The second driver should run at the end of the class in which they are entered. If not possible due to time constraints, they run at the end of the next class, (or if the next class is very small the run must be taken within **20** cars of the end of the first driver's class) This the normal system to which the Clerk of the Course will work with settled weather conditions, if a change in conditions looks likely he may need to give different instructions to paddock control. Also if there is a hold up on the hill, shared cars would be asked to run immediately after the re-start.

It is important to **nominate running order on shared drivers' entry forms**, by indicating which driver will go first. The second driver will display the numeral 7 or 9 before their number.

BUGATTI OWNERS' CLUB 'PAUL MATTY SPORTSCARS' CLASSIC CHAMPIONSHIP

A championship for Bugatti Owners' Club members with a National 'A' licence, driving pre 1972 saloon, sports, sports racing and racing cars, run on a handicap basis with points awarded, counting towards an end of season trophy and class awards.

BUGATTI OWNERS' CLUB MEMBERS 'B' LICENCE PRESCOTT CHALLENGE

Based on a handicap system, this is for 'B' licence Bugatti Owners' Club members, competing in class Q throughout the season with points awarded. At two-day meetings, drivers will practice and compete on Sunday and will be competing for the Peter Stubberfield Trophy.

THE MIKE MARSHALL PRESCOTT BUGATTI CAR CHALLENGE

This is a challenge for fully paid up members of the Bugatti Owners' Club driving a Bugatti car and will be run on a handicap basis with points awarded, counting towards the end of season trophy.

At 2 day events, drivers practice and compete on Sunday and require a National 'B' licence minimum.

THE BUGATTI OWNERS CLUB ELECTRIC CAR CHALLENGE

The Bugatti Owners' Club offers a prize for the first electric car to beat 40 seconds on the Prescott long course.

ADDRESS LABELS

If you require notification of entry receipt, please enclose an adhesive self - addressed label or email address with entry.

CAMPING

The fee for motor homes and caravans is £10-00 and £7-00 for tents. Please add the appropriate amount to your entry fee and indicate your request on the entry form. Please fill in your vehicle registration number.

PRESCOTT ENVIRONMENT

The Prescott area has become very sensitive about noise and we are regularly monitored by the local Council. Please act sensibly with regard to noise issues and drive with care especially on the return road.

START TIMES

Saturday starts at approx 9-00hrs & Sunday at 9-30hrs. (See final instructions for definitive times) drivers in early classes, please be ready to run ten minutes before this and listen out for Paddock announcements.

EMERGENCIES

In the case of an emergency being called on the hill, please report to the club office where you will be kept informed of the current situation.

1. All meetings will be governed by the General Rules of the MSA, these S.R's and any written instruction's the Bugatti Owners Club may issue, will have the same force as these regulations.
2. All vehicles must comply with the MSA Vehicle and Tyre regulations.
3. The Bugatti Owners Club 'B' licence and Bugatti Handicap classes will be decided on a handicap basis. The handicaps will be assessed after practice for each event, based on known competitor's performance or practice times on the day.
4. For competitors in the Bugatti Owners Club classes Pi and Pii the use of slick tyres is prohibited. The type, size and tread of tyre must remain the same throughout the meeting. Post 1945 cars must run on treaded tyres which may be road tyres complying with the Motor Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations, or racing tyres as long as the latter have grooves in the tread pattern which must be lateral and circumferential and any 40mm diameter areas of the tyre must have grooves in at least two different directions, which themselves must have a minimum width of 3mm. Tyres for Class M are the same as above and classes N are free.
5. The length of the course is 1127 yards, consisting of 2 hairpins, 5 corners and a number of bends rising to the finish which is marked by a white line, banner and chequered boards on each side of the road. Cars start singly, the starting signal being the display of a green light. Timing equipment will be started and stopped by the interception of a light beam.
6. Practice arrangements; Two day meetings; on Saturday signing on will start at 8-00hrs, with scrutineering immediately after. Practice will start at 9-00hrs and will continue until approximately 13-00hrs, when a break will be taken for lunch. There will be two practice runs (any subsequent runs will be given at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course, if time permits). The Clerk of the Course reserves the right to suspend any driver from taking a third or fourth practice run if he or she is judged to be holding up the procedure, he may also finish practice at his discretion.
For one day meetings the format is two practice (any subsequent runs will be given at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course, if time permits) followed by two competitive runs.
At all events, engines must not be run before 08-00hrs.

Paid up members driving a Bugatti in class O - £25-00
The maximum number of entries is 200 (or 145 for a one-day event) the minimum number is 80 (50 for a one-day event) The club reserves the right to combine classes where numbers necessitate.
Results; These will be posted soon after classes finish, and may be collected from the Clubhouse after the prize-giving. A copy will be posted out to all competitors during the following week.

Notes:

- 1/ All Caterham, Lotus Seven, Westfield and other 'kit' cars complying with S11 and S12 of the MSA year book, will enter class B and D. All other cars of this type which do not comply with the above will enter class F or G and comply with the relevant safety regulations.
- 2/ Vehicles competing in class J(i) must comply with the appropriate MSA Formulae Regulations
- 3/ To be eligible for class M, vehicles of monocoque construction and those with rear wings are allowed, provided they were standard on the car at the appropriate date. Wheel rim width may be increased by no more than 25cm, but period style must be retained. The use of slick tyres is prohibited in class M. The type, size and tread of tyre must remain the same throughout the meeting. Post 1945 cars must run on treaded tyres which may be road tyres complying with the Motor Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations, or racing tyres as long as the latter have grooves in the tread pattern which must be lateral and circumferential and any 40mm diameter areas of the tyre must have grooves in at least two different directions, which themselves must have a minimum width of 3mm.

13. The organizers reserve the right to merge or sub-divide, classes at the commencement of the event should entries justify this. Classes may be split into various capacities depending on numbers.

14. Cars must be entered in their correct capacity class. In all classes MSA Year book section S10.3.1 and 10.3.2 apply for cars with forced induction and rotary engined cars.

15. Cars in Class O (the Bugatti Handicap) may also enter in Class P. If they do the entrant must pay the full entry fee, hold an National 'A' Speed category licence and practice on the Saturday. Class O drivers will practice just before lunch and take timed runs immediately after lunch.

Class P will run as per programme order. Drivers in class O and Q are not required to practice on a Saturday and need only a Non-Race National 'B' Competition licence.
Drivers in class O pay an entry fee of £25 - drivers in class Q pay the full entry fee.

Cars running in invited club championship classes run to their own regulations as specified by the championship co-ordinator with the Bugatti Owners Club.

17. Competition licences will be inspected at signing-on. All Prescott **two-day** meetings require a National 'A' Speed Licence ('A' Open for classes G, L, M and N as per HJ). Bugatti Owners' Club drivers competing in the Bugatti Owners Club 'B' Licence Challenge and Bugatti Car Handicap only, plus drivers in the HSA championship, the Midland Speed Championships (27th /28th June), the Aston Martin Owners Club members (5th September) only require a National 'B' category licence.
One-day club meetings only require a Non-Race National 'B' licence minimum.

18. All cars must be silenced in accordance with MSA Regulations. J5.17. The maximum reading (at 2/3 maximum revs) allowed is 110dBa for Racing and Sports Libre Cars and 108dBa for all other categories, when measured at 0.5m from the tailpipe at an angle of 45 degrees and at a height of 0.5m to 1.0m above the ground. This test will be carried out immediately before the warming-up line just after the paddock exit gate. In addition, Prescott may take measurements from the side of the track for a maximum reading of 104dBa as an indicator. Section J.17.4 does not apply.
19. Paddock Safety; Attention should be paid to Q13. Car engines should not be run with gears engaged whilst the vehicle has any driving wheels not in direct contact with the ground, unless all moving parts are adequately guarded, jack handles properly secured and a competent person is seated in the driver's seat. Similarly attention should be paid to MSA Blue book regulation S.9 with regard to fuel and refueling and the general handling of fuel.
20. Two yellow lines are marked on the track after the paddock gate and tyre warming may only be carried out between them, in this designated area. Section S9.3.1. Assistance to drivers on the start line must not exceed two persons and meeting officials. Section S9.3.4 and S9.3.5
21. Engines must not be run before 8-30hrs on Saturday or 9-00 hrs on Sunday, (final instructions will state/confirm anything different) on both practice and competition days.

Class awards; for first, second and third in each class subject to: 3 starters for a first class award six starters for a second class award and nine starters for a third in class award.

23. Prescott Gold-Cup – A Bugatti Owners Club Members Challenge Cup awarded annually.
 First Place £250 - Second Place £175 - Third Place £100

A list of target times is shown below and these times remain final for the entire season. Entry for the meeting constitutes entry for the Gold Cup. Championship run-offs do not count for this award. The Gold Cup will be awarded at the end of the season, to the Bugatti Owners Club member, who at any meeting counting for the Cup, beats the target time for his/her class by the greatest margin. If there is no improvement over the target time, the competitor whose time is closest to the target time shall be the winner. In the event if a tie for first, second or third places, the competitors concerned shall take a further run up the hill, the one making the best improvement against their target time shall be judged the winner. If only one competitor in the tie is present then he/she shall be deemed the winner, without taking an extra run. In the event of a dispute over these rules, the decision of the Club Stewards shall be final.

24. BOC Prescott 'B' Licence Challenge – Based on a handicap system, this is for; 'B' licence members, competing in class Q throughout the season, and awarded at the discretion of the handicapper. The winner receives the Peter Stubberfield Trophy to hold for one year.
25. The Prescott Classic Car Championship classes - These classes are for 'A' licence holders, driving Saloon Cars (Class Pi) and Sports cars (Class Pii) run on handicap. Incorporated in this, four rounds of the Bugatti Owners' Club 'Paul Matty Sportscar' Classic Championship, with members driving pre 1972 Saloon, Sports, Sports Racing and Racing Cars, run on a handicap basis, with the Sports Racing and Sports Cars running in Class M.

26. The Bugatti Challenge – awarded to the highest scoring Bugatti driver, on a points scoring basis.
Only those competitors who are paid up members of the Bugatti Owners’ Club by April 1st of the current year are eligible to compete for the Gold Cup, the Members ‘B’ Licence Challenge and the Bugatti Car Challenge.

At two-day meetings; entries to major championships will take priority over Bugatti Owners Club challenge competitors.

Bugatti Owners' Club Health and Safety

Health and Safety is law in the workplace to ensure so far, as is practicable, that your health, safety and welfare are protected.

The running of sporting events falls partly under the act. We therefore ask for your help and co-operation in making the running of the meeting safe for all.

General:-

- NO CYCLING in the Paddock.
- CHILDREN MUST be accompanied by an adult at all times when they are in the paddock.
- A SPEED LIMIT OF 10 mph is the maximum in the Paddock.
- In the event of FIRE or OTHER EMERGENCY, instructions will be given to go to the assembly points near the START LINE.

Competitors:-

- Only persons who have signed on may accompany cars to the tyre warming area and only two to the start area.
- Keep your pit area clear of trip hazards and competitors are advised to keep all dangerous equipment and machinery in safe working condition and only allow a competent person to use the equipment. You are advised to keep all equipment secure.
- Store fuel in approved containers appropriately marked.
- When REFUELLING ensure that the area is as clear as possible, and that there is NO SMOKING or other source of ignition. The driver must be out of the car, the engine stopped and have a fire extinguisher at the ready.
- All competitors must be present at the pre-event briefing.

Marshals:-

- Manual Handling should be avoided and where possible heavy lifting equipment is to be used.
- Where manual handling has to be used, safe lifting techniques are to be used e.g. team lifting. See 'getting to grips with manual handling' displayed in the Marshals Pound and Paddock Office.
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) should be worn. Where provided by the club you will be required to sign that you understand the necessity to use the equipment.
- All Marshals will be given a copy of 'A Pocket Guide to Marshalling' when they sign-on. We advise Marshals to read this and if you have any queries please speak to a Senior Official.

This list is neither exclusive nor exhaustive: any act or omission that is fundamental to the safe running of the meeting must be guarded against.

Please remember that we are all responsible, not only for the safety of the public, but also for our own safety and that of each other.

ACCIDENTS If you have an accident involving injury to yourself, a third party or any damage to property, you must report as soon as possible to the CLUB OFFICE
